About ABA Services

Applied Behavior Analysis or ABA is an evidence-based treatment method that has become widely accepted among health care professionals to treat individuals with autism. ABA encourages the development of many skills and is tailored to each individual based on their needs.

ABA programs range from 10-40 hours per week. Individualized treatment is prescribed based on each child's needs and medical necessity.

The Role of... BCBA | LBS

Your Board Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA) or Licensed Behavior Specialist (LBS) is responsible for conducting assessments, developing individualized programs, training behavior technicians, and evaluating progress. A behavior support plan is developed that includes teaching strategies to reach the short term and long term goals for your child. The BCBA or LBS facilitates regular team meetings, school consultations, parent trainings, treatment, and collaborations across settings and caregivers.

The Role of... RBT | BHT

Your Registered Behavior Technician (RBT) or Behavior Health Technician (BHT) is responsible for implementing teaching procedures, collecting data on behaviors and skill acquisition, generating session notes, organizing materials, and notifying the BCBA of any concerns related to your child's progress and programs. The technician will strive to make each session a fun and joyful experience for your child.

8 Essentials for Effective Interventions



Dosage

For the best results, follow the number of prescribed weekly therapy hours.



Variety

Conduct services across settings, materials, and instructors to promote generalization.



Timing

Get started with interventions as early as possible.



Data

Take data to formulate effective teaching strategies and reach goals.



Reinforce

Provide positive reinforcement on skills to maximize a child's potential.



Instruct

Conduct one-to-one or very small group instruction.



Care

Ensure caregiver involvement in treatment and training of skills.



Goals

Have goals with specific targets across developmental domains.

The Journey to ABA Therapy



Glossary of Terms

Dosage

The amount of weekly therapy hours prescribed by the clinical team. Proper dosage is critical to making meaningful gains and reaching goals.

IBA

An Initial Behavior Assessment consists of caregiver interviews and child observations/assessments to identify needed skills and targeted behaviors.

Biopsychosocial

This assessment may be part of an initial clinical evaluation to assess biological, psychological, and social factors.

ADOS

The Autism Diagnostic Observation Schedule involves a series of tasks/observations to assess for features of autism/ASD.
